- 2. Wait for the blue GPS dot to stabilize, then tap the current location icon ().
- 3. Read the three words to the 911 operator.



WIRELESS CALLS DON'T WORK LIKE YOU THINK THEY DO!

HELP FIRST RESPONDERS FIND YOU FAST!

YOU ARE THE HELP UNTIL HELP ARRIVES!

Wireless calls don't work like you think they do!

An inadequate number of cell towers in rural areas often misroute the emergency call. For these reasons, the wireless caller needs to know their precise location to reach the correct county 911 public safety answering point (PSAP).

Help First Responders find you fast!

Install Reflective House Numbers at your driveway entrance to ensure First Responders can find you fast. Numbers should be seen coming from both directions and placed 4 to
